#### **Special Report of the Auditor General**

This report has been prepared under section 20 of the Audit Act 2003 which prescribes that:

- 20. (1)** The Auditor General may at any time prepare and submit a special report to the Governor if she is satisfied that there is a matter that should be brought to the attention of the Governor.
- (2)** The Governor shall, within three months of the receipt of the special report, cause the report to be laid before the Legislative Council.
- (3)** The Auditor General shall at the same time as submitting the special report to the Governor submit a copy of the special report to the Minister and the Financial Secretary.

## Executive Summary

- E-1. An audit examination was performed to assess the implementation and application of the Government's stimulus programme for farmers and fishermen that was launched as a part of the COVID-19 recovery initiative.
- E-2. The audit examination was impeded by the failure of the Premier's Office to provide documents requested for this review. This is a direct contravention of Audit Act 19 (2)(d) and is contrary to public sector best practice policies for transparency and accountability.
- E-3. A total of \$1.4 million was paid in Farmers Stimulus grants to persons who were not registered in the Agriculture database of registered farmers.
- E-4. The funding requests submitted by farmers were inflated by the Ministry (Premier's Office) prior to payment. This resulted in individuals receiving payments that were substantially greater than what they had requested.
- E-5. There was an absence of accountability for how the grant amounts were issued and applied. The controls approved by Cabinet for management and monitoring of this programme were not adopted.
- E-6. More than half of the Fishermen Stimulus Grants recipients were not licensed as required by the Fisheries Legislation and Fisheries Regulations. A total of \$1.2 million was paid to unlicensed fishermen.
- E-7. The fishermen grants were intended to assist with equipment and material costs. Payments were however made to both vessel owners and crew members resulting in multiple members on the same vessel receiving grants. This included grant awards to multiple vessel members requesting assistance for the same equipment.
- E-8. Several instances were noted where individuals received more than one grant under this programme. In a few instances this manifested with duplicate grants for the same occupation (two farmers grants) but in most cases the individuals received both a farmer's grant and a fisherman's grant which together totaled from \$22,500 to \$42,500. There were also cases where individuals who received farmers/fishermen grants also received grants from other government stimulus programmes.
- E-9. The absence of controls in the implementation and administration of this programme has left the Government without means of assessing how the funds were applied.

## Objective and Scope

1. The audit covers the activity related to the BVI Government's Farmers and Fishermen stimulus Grant initiative undertaken by the Government in response to the negative economic impact resulting from COVID-19 shutdowns.

### Objective

2. The purpose of the audit is to provide independent information and advice on:
- Whether approved procedures were followed in the adoption and execution of the farmers and fishermen stimulus programme;
  - Whether the objectives of the programme to expand local commercial fishing and agricultural activity was achieved;
  - Whether the funds were applied with due regard to the principles of value for money.

### Scope

3. The examination included a review of promulgated public policy with respect to the programme, documents and files obtained from the Ministry of Finance, Department of Agriculture and Fisheries (the Department), Cabinet Office and verification of payment activity through the Treasury System. Interviews were also performed with key personnel and site inspections were undertaken at farms of grant recipients.

4. The expenditure and payments quoted in this report are as at 20 May 2021.

### Restriction of Scope

5. The Auditor General's Office was unable to obtain the relevant files and information from the Premier's Office pertaining to the COVID-19 stimulus grants which were repeatedly requested by e-mail and telephone. This includes access to databases, documents, reports and other information relevant to policy development and implementation of the programmes.

6. The refusal to present this information is in direct contravention of the VI Constitution and the Audit Act which provide for this office to have access to government documents and records. No public officer expending public funds has the authority to deny information requested for audit purposes.

## Background

7. As part of the Economic Stimulus package for COVID-19, two million dollars (\$2,000,000) from the Social Security Board Grant was allotted to assist farmers and fishermen. In announcing the programme on 28 May 2020 the Premier stated that the funding for farmers would be used for cutting access roads to farms, fencing properties as well as other means to increase and support food production. For fishermen, the funding was to be used to purchase engines, nets and other equipment needed to help them increase their production. The ultimate intention of the grant was to boost agriculture and fisheries production in the Virgin Islands while creating jobs and increasing food supply.

8. The publicized application period ran from 5 June to 10 July 2020. Payments to farmers and fishermen commenced in October 2020.

## Eligibility of Farmers/Fishermen

9. The programme was open to any commercial farmer or fisherman who is a BVIlander, Belonger, Naturalised Citizen or Permanent Resident registered with the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries and in the case of fishermen - licensed commercial fishers as defined under the Virgin Islanders Fisheries Act, 1997 and Regulations 2003.

## Budgeted Amount

10. An initial amount of two million dollars from the Social Security Board Grant was budgeted for this project. An amendment to the grant agreement dated 15 December 2020 reallocated an additional \$1.5 million from the SSB housing programme to the Farmers and Fishermen grants, increasing the total to **\$3.5 million**. We were unable to identify any additional funding that was allocated directly to this programme.

## Actual to Date

11. As at **20 May 2021** the Treasury records indicated that the total amount paid under the Farmers and Fisherfolk Stimulus programme was **\$5,140,000**. Of this \$2,218,000 was paid to fisherfolk (hereinafter referred to in this report as fishermen) and \$2,922,000 to farmers.

## Addendum

12. The Farmers and Fishermen grant amount of \$6,148,500 publicized in the HOA on 13 May 2021 have not been substantiated against the actual payments issued by the Treasury Department. The actual payments (cheques issued) at that date totaled \$5,140,000.

## Farmers Stimulus Grants

13. Forty-nine percent of the amount paid in farmer's stimulus grants totaling \$1,437,000 was awarded to persons who were not recorded in the Agriculture database of registered Farmers.

14. The farmer's eligibility criteria for grant award required either registration with the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries as a farmer or submission of a notarized letter of referral verifying engagement in commercial farming for the past three years. Farmers were also required to demonstrate engagement in commercial farming per the department's established criteria which outlines the number of livestock and farming acreage qualifying as commercial.

15. The Department's farmer registration process involves undertaking a site assessment to confirm the type of farm, its size, and the condition of the area, in order to log and scale its operations. This assessment determines whether the undertaking constitutes commercially scaled farming or backyard farming. Individuals who fail to meet the Department's criteria for commercial farming were required to provide evidence of commercial farming occupation within the past three years in a manner not covered by the criteria.

16. As at 20 May 2021 there were 203 payments issued in farmer's stimulus grants. Of the amount paid, 49% totaling \$1,437,000 was made to persons not registered with the Department of Agriculture. No information was provided on how these individuals qualified for grant award.

17. On 18 June 2020 Cabinet approved the Farmers and Fisherfolk stimulus policy. The documents submitted to support the policy included a schedule of 95 persons as "Commercial Farmers Registered for Economic Stimulus" (Cabinet's List or Cabinet's Farmer's List).

18. The audit examined the distribution of payments between the persons who had been submitted to Cabinet as "Registered Commercial Farmers" and others outside that list who received payments.



## Commercial Farmers Cabinet List

19. *Almost half of the persons on the Cabinet List of Commercial Farmers were not registered in the Agriculture database of registered Farmers.*

20. Review of the records indicated that 42 of the 95 persons on this list were not registered with the Agriculture and Fisheries Department as farmers. No information was received from the Premier's Office on how the list submitted to Cabinet was compiled.

21. The records at the Treasury Department at 20 May 2021 indicated that 39 payments had been issued to persons on that schedule. Of these, 29 were to persons registered with Agriculture as farmers. The total amount paid out to individuals on that list was \$636,000 as in the Table below and in Appendix 1 of this report.

## Other Farmer Payments

22. *Similarly, fifty-seven percent of other persons who received farming grants were not listed in the Agriculture database of registered Farmers.*

23. In addition to the payments made to individuals on the Cabinet list, there were 164 other payments made in farmers' stimulus grants totaling \$2,286,000.

24. Approximately 57% (93 of the 164 payments) were to individuals not registered with the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries as farmers. Payments to unregistered persons totaled \$1,282,500. The remaining payments of \$1,003,500 were made to registered individuals. Appendix 2 refers.

25. No information or evidence has been provided to indicate how the unregistered persons receiving \$1,282,500 were assessed as qualifying for grant award. The Department of Agriculture and Fisheries indicated that it was not involved in the process of assessing the individuals. This was handled by the Premier's Office.

26. Site inspections were performed by audit staff to verify the existence of a sample of persons receiving the farmer's stimulus grant. This was done with the assistance of the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries whose responsibility involves assessing and assisting commercial farmers.

27. Of the 22 properties selected for site visits, 11 could not be located by the Agriculture Department's staff. We were therefore unable to verify the existence of these farms. Eleven farms were located. Of these 7 were on government property leased out to farmers in Paraquita Bay and 4 others were on private land. Two of the farms visited on private land showed farming activity, which did not meet the scale of operations criteria for commercial farming.

### **Determination of Farmer's Grant Amounts**

28. *The amounts requested by farmers were inflated by the Ministry prior to payment. This resulted in payments that were substantially greater than the amounts requested.*

29. Farmers requesting stimulus relief were required to provide details of the type of assistance needed and how the funds would be applied.

30. An audit examination was performed on a sample of requests made by 70 farmers. The entries detailed needs, which varied from K. J.'s request for \$259.95 to purchase soil, to L. M.'s application for \$22,000 to build chicken coops and a pig pen.

31. The requests in the sample totaled \$351,730.83. The grant amounts paid to persons on this schedule totaled \$1,008,000 (See Appendix 3). Almost three times the value of the requests.

32. The audit review found that a standard payment of either \$13,500 or \$22,500 was made to each farmer irrespective of request or need.

33. The schedules examined showed that the amounts requested by farmers were modified by the Ministry and increased dramatically resulting in significantly larger payouts. An example of the inflated requests is shown in the table below and further (non-exhaustive) examples are in Appendix 4.

34. A few cases were also noted where farmer's requests exceeded the amounts awarded. In such cases the individual was granted the maximum payment of \$22,500.

### Monitoring Application of Funds Farmers Grants

35. *There is no accountability for how the grant amounts were applied despite the excessive amounts awarded.*

36. The policy approved by Cabinet included controls to ensure that the grant funds were applied within the intentions of the programme and that value for money was pursued in the attainment of this objective.

37. The approved controls included:

- i. Assessment and verification of applicants by the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries or any other entity determined by the Premier's Office.
- ii. Assessment by either the Public Works Department, or contractor or quantity surveyor approved by the Premier's Office where repairs to structures or physical works were requested;
- iii. Direct payments to suppliers and contractors with the presentation of a proforma invoice;
- iv. Monitoring of produce by the Agriculture and Fisheries Department to record growth and progress of the local industry after the programme.

38. On 29 July 2020, the Premier's Office submitted a log of applications to the Ministry ECYAF&A to be reviewed by the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries to ascertain which of the applicants were active. The individuals recorded in the submitted log accounted for less than half of persons receiving stimulus grants, indicating that the assessment process was thereafter assumed by the Premier's Office. The programme was implemented and payments made without any further involvement of the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries or its resources.

39. The Public Works Department was not involved in any assessment related to the programme.

40. The Department of Agriculture and Fisheries has not been able to undertake any substantial monitoring due to resource restrictions.

41. All payments in the programme were made directly to the applicants. No instances were observed where direct payments were made to suppliers or contractors. There were 203 payments to farmers distributed in sums indicated below.

42. The end result was a programme implemented without controls resulting in significant threats to the Government receiving value on the monies distributed into the industry.

## Fishermen Stimulus Grants

43. *More than half of the persons receiving fishermen stimulus grants were not registered on the Fishermen Licensed database.*

44. The Fisheries Act 1997 and Fisheries Regulations 2003 require vessels fishing in territorial waters to obtain a fishing licence for boat, owner, master and crew. This conveys permission to fish and facilitates the Agriculture and Fisheries Department in regulating and monitoring the industry. The Regulations also provide that persons failing to adhere to this requirement could be subject to conviction and fines of up to \$50,000.

45. Fishermen wishing to take advantage of the stimulus grant were required by the policy to be licensed as commercial fishermen in accordance with the legislation, or to have held such a licence within the past three years. At 20 May 2021 there were 208 payments to fishermen totaling \$2,218,000. Approximately 44% of these were made to persons licensed with the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries.

46. The stimulus policy also made allowance for unlicensed fishermen to apply for grant award by submitting a notarized letter of referral from a fit and proper person verifying their engagement in fishing for the past three years. The legislation does not however provide for such exceptions. The audit review indicated that more than half (56%) of the payments made in fishermen stimulus grants were to unlicensed individuals. These totaled in excess of \$1.2 million.

## Cabinet Licensed List For Fishermen

47. The audit examined the distribution of payments between persons who had been submitted to Cabinet as approved licensed fishermen and others outside that list who received payments.

48. The registered Commercial List of fishermen submitted to Cabinet recorded 36 individuals. Thirty-two of these were recorded on the list of licensed fishermen in accordance with the Fisheries Regulations 2003 and 4 were not.

49. At 20 May 2021, twenty-five individuals on that list had been issued fishermen grants in amounts varying from \$9,000 to \$20,000 for a total of \$298,000 as seen in Appendix 5. Grant recipients included two individuals who were not licensed to fish per Agriculture and Fisheries Records.

**Other Fishermen Payments**

50. Sixty-two percent (62%) of other persons receiving fishermen stimulus grants were not registered in the Conservation and Fisheries database as licensed fishermen.

51. In addition to the 25 payments to fishermen on the Cabinet list, the Treasury’s records at 20 May 2021 indicated that 183 further payments totaling \$1,920,000 were made in fishing grants to other fishermen. Of these individuals, 65 (38%) were registered in the Agriculture and Fisheries licensing database and 118 (62%) were not registered. The table below refers. Appendix 6 provides a list of ‘Other Fishermen’ that received stimulus grants.

**Fishermen Designation**

52. Multiple members on the same vessel received fishing stimulus grants. No distinction was made with respect to master/owner and crew.

53. The payments issued to licensed fishermen were for the most part made to the Master/Owner of the vessel. We were however unable to determine designation for most of the persons receiving payments as these were issued to unlicensed individuals.

54. The records showed cases where both master/owner and crew members on the same vessel received payments. Some of these can be seen in Appendix 7.

55. For the “All In One” the master and crew member received a \$20,000 grant each. The two Master/Owners for the Argus III, received a \$15,000 grant each. Similarly, the two Master/Owners for the Reorn P also received individual grants (\$9,000 each).

56. Three members of the Hokeda, the Maldiv and Simply E-Z each received stimulus payments. Most of these were crew members.

57. The master/owner of the vessels “Give Thanks” & “Never Give Up 1” was award \$9,000. This was less than the amount awarded to one of his crew who received \$20,000.

58. There were in addition, instances where the master/owner of the vessel did not receive a relief grant but crew members did. This was seen in the case of the Maldiv where all 3 grant recipients were registered as crew (one received \$9,000 and the other two were awarded \$15,000 each).

59. Payment of grant amounts to crew members appears inconsistent with the policy which states that the funds are intended for equipment and material purchase, and more in line with a gratuitous payment to persons working on fishing boats.

**Application for Fishing Grant**

60. *Applications were noted where master and crew applied for the same objects and each received payments.*

61. The application process entailed submitting completed application forms directly to the Premier’s Office together with proof of status, estimate of materials, works to be done or equipment required, and a copy of the fishing licence or notarized letter verifying engagement in fishing for the past three years.

62. An analysis was performed for a sample of 82 applicants for the fishermen stimulus aid. The funding requests were made by 40 Master/Owners, 12 crew and 30 Unlicensed applicants whose designations are unknown, as seen in the table below.

63. The applicants' requests commonly included multiple needs (equipment, materials, engine etc). These for the most part, included items as indicated below.

64. Examination of the details revealed instances where both master/owner and crew applied for the same equipment. In one such case, three individuals (master/owner and two crew members) on the Hokeda applied separately for engines and material. All three were awarded grants.

65. *No vetting was performed to assess the legitimacy of requests. Especially given the range of costs submitted for the same needs.*

66. The sample showed an overwhelming request for funds to purchase engines. These varied from \$4,100.00 from the Master/Owner of Sprat, to \$75,280.00 requested by an unlicensed applicant.

67. There appears to have been no vetting of the applications to ascertain genuine need or to verify the value of the amounts stated. As with the Agricultural grants, the Ministry approved payments in fixed amounts of \$9,000; \$15,000 and \$20,000 per fisherman. No information was provided on how the award for each person was determined. The Agriculture and Fisheries Department advised that they were not involved in this process.

## Duplicated & Multiple Payments – Farming & Fishing

68. Instances were noted where individuals received more than one stimulus payment under this programme.

69. Examination of the payments processed through the Treasury indicated that some persons received two payments for Farmer relief as indicated below.

70. Similarly, the two individuals shown below were identified as receiving duplicate grants for fishermen.

71. In addition, a total of 18 individuals received both fishing and farming stimulus grants. The totals for these varied from \$22,500 to \$42,500 to each person. These are shown in Appendix 8. Other duplicate payments were observed for Lionel Smith, Carlton Benners and Nathan White. These were however reversed. No reversals were seen for the recipients listed above.

72. There were also individuals who received grants from other government COVID–19 stimulus programmes in addition to receiving the farmer/fisherman grant. Those observed are shown in Appendix 9. There was no system in place to ascertain the genuineness of individuals seeking multiple forms of support.

## Registration Databases

73. Databases are maintained by the Department of Agriculture & Fisheries for fishermen and farmers. One as required by the Fisheries Act and Fisheries Regulations for fishermen. The other is maintained for registered farmers (commercial and non-commercial).



74. To assess eligibility of the individuals who received grants under this programme, the audit office used the registration databases provided by Agriculture and Fisheries. Some challenges were encountered as the databases at times did not record complete information. In particular the registration dates on the Agriculture database was often missing.

75. The records listed 579 registered farmers from 2007-2020. Between 2007 and 2009 the log identified 58 registered farmers. In 2020 a total of 159 persons registered as farmers. Of these, 143 did so in the seven-month period after the stimulus programme was announced, from May to November 2020.

76. Another challenge presented by the Agriculture database was the absence of farmer classification into “commercial” and “non-commercial” for the persons registered. Without this we were unable to ascertain true eligibility of registered individuals.

## **Conclusion**

77. The objective of achieving food security is one that should be pursued. This should however be done in a strategic and holistic manner that allows the public agencies and resources charged with the responsibility of overseeing and managing the territory’s agriculture and fisheries industries to take the lead and manage the process.

78. The failure to adopt Cabinet’s mandated procedures for implementation and monitoring of this programme has resulted in the disbursement of a substantial amount of public funds without effective means of assessing how these were applied and measuring the impact, if any, on the agricultural and fishing industries.

79. The exclusion of the two key agencies (the Ministry of Education, Culture, Youth Affairs, Fisheries & Agriculture and the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries) from this process demonstrates an absence of interest in achieving any real outcome with the payments, which for some served as needed assistance to advance their commercial fishing and agricultural undertakings, but for many were simply gratuitous, meritless awards at the expense of the public.

## **Recommendations**

1. Persons responsible for administering this programme should account for the absence of transparency and accountability.
2. The Ministry (Premier’s Office) should provide full information on how decisions on determination of grant award and distribution was arrived at.
3. Fishermen who have been operating unlicensed in territorial waters should be made to license in accordance with the Fisheries Act and Fisheries Regulations.

4. A programme should be implemented by the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries in conjunction with the Ministry of Education, Culture, Youth Affairs, Fisheries and Agriculture to follow-up on, and monitor, how the funds have been used by recipients.
5. An assessment should be made as to whether there has been a breach of Public Finance Management Regulations 73(b)(i) and (ii) in the administration of public funds especially as it relates to falsifying the requests made by farmers that resulted in excess payouts.
6. To maximize potential impact and outcome, programmes with long term prospects should be undertaken and managed by the oversight ministries. This allows for improved efficiency and long term monitoring.
7. Where Cabinet in rendering a decision prescribes controls for management of public funds, these should be adopted.

# ADDENDUM

## To Auditor General's Report on

COVID -19 Stimulus Grants to Farmers and Fisherfolk

29 May 2024

### Commission of Inquiry Recommendation B13

80. The Government of the Virgin Islands' COVID-19 stimulus grant programme for Farmers and Fisherfolk was implemented to provide assistance to qualifying individuals during the COVID-19 recovery period. The Office of the Auditor General performed an examination of this programme in 2021 that resulted in the appended report which was dated 21 June 2021. The audit was however impeded due to the non-submission of information that was requested from the Premier's Office which was tasked with the implementation of this and other COVID-19 recovery assistance programmes.

81. The BVI Commission of Inquiry's recommendation B13 in its report dated 4 April 2022 called for a full audit of the Farmers and Fisherfolk COVID-19 assistance grant programme, among others, with the expectation that the information withheld would be made available for full examination.

82. In pursuant of the COI Recommendation, the Audit Office has received and reviewed additional information regarding the implementation and administration of this programme. The findings of this extended review substantially support the conclusions of the initial report to which this addendum is appended. To avoid repetition, we highlight here only new information impacting this programme.

83. At 29 May 2024 the total payments made on the COVID-19 Farmer and Fisherfolk Stimulus grant programme was \$5,390,500 as indicated in the table below.

### Conflicting Application Process

86. One of the most egregious missteps in the implementation of the programme was the double application process, which may have resulted in qualified individuals missing the grant award. Both the Premier's Office and the Ministry of Education, Culture, Youth Affairs, Fisheries, and Agriculture (referred to hereafter as the Ministry for Agriculture) undertook separate application processes.

87. The first process was conducted by the Ministry for Agriculture during the period from 23 March 2020 to 14 April 2020. The Ministry for Agriculture's application form was made available via Survey Monkey, and farmers and fishermen were asked to complete it to benefit from the stimulus program. The Department of Agriculture forwarded the application to individuals for completion and assisted those who needed help to do so.

88. This process yielded 278 applications, providing varying details of farming and fishing activities, challenges, and needs.

89. The information gathered was used to compile two lists: one comprising Commercial Farmers and the other of Commercial Fishermen. These lists were forwarded to the Premier's Office for consideration in the stimulus package and subsequently submitted to Cabinet. The names are listed in Appendix 1 and Appendix 5 attached.

90. The second application process was rolled out by the Premier's Office and ran from 5 June 2020 to 10 July 2020.

91. The process was facilitated by members of the House of Assembly, who contacted individuals within their districts and distributed the new application forms.

Despite having contact information from the initial applicants, these individuals were not specifically alerted that a further application was necessary. Many either assumed that their submission to the Ministry for Agriculture was sufficient or were unaware that more was needed.

92. More than two-thirds (68%) of the initial respondents did not submit the second application required to qualify for the grant. Many of these were legitimate farmers and fishermen registered in the government's databases.

93. Twenty percent of those who failed to apply in the second process were awarded grants, while the vast majority (80%) were not. For those who did apply, 88% received grants.

94. In effect, the process as executed failed to serve some individuals who fit squarely within the grant criteria. While a number of persons from the initial process would not have met the requirements for award, there were some that did. These individuals were unable to benefit due to the fragmented way in which the programme was implemented.

### **Determination of Grant Amounts**

95. The applications for assistance from the second process were received by the Premier's Office where they were compiled into two spreadsheets referred to as the Farmer's Stimulus Application Log and the Fishermen Stimulus Application log.

96. The application log spreadsheets were forwarded to the Agriculture Department which was asked to review the same and advise which farmers and fishermen were active based on the information at that Department. These spreadsheets were also used during the initial audit process in the comparative between requests and actual payments.

97. Most of the applications were accompanied with statements and estimates to support the grant requests. A review of these showed that in a number of cases the information and amounts in the application logs did not align with the actual requests made by farmers and fishermen. This discrepancy would have been relevant if Cabinet's directive on grant disbursement had been followed.

98. Cabinet's directive required submission of quotations, assessment by Public Works Department (or other designated person) and direct payment to vendors. Instead, the Premier's Office implemented a system of standardized grant awards, bypassing

assessments, and made direct payments to applicants. The payments were based on the formula in the table below.

99. This resulted in payouts in excess of need without any system to monitor how the funds were applied.

**Paraquita Bay Farmers**

100. Crown land at Paraquita Bay is managed by the Department of Agriculture for farmers’ use. It comprises approximately 77 plots, with seven specifically assigned to the Department of Agriculture. The others are allotted to farmers for commercial livestock and crops cultivation. Almost a third of these are listed in the Department’s records as inactive. Leases for the plots are overseen by the Ministry of Natural Resources and Labour. Currently, there is only one plot that has been assigned under a lease.

101. A total of \$342,000 was paid to 22 farmers occupying plots at Paraquita Bay. An inspection of these plots revealed some active farms with crops in various stages of cultivation. Five of the 22 payments were made to farmers whose plots are listed in the Department’s records as inactive.

102. The Department of Agriculture oversees the condition of the lots in terms of fencing, water access and storage. Several of the plots are in very poor condition, with some still showing signs of hurricane debris. One individual accumulated old and rotted vehicles on one of the agricultural plots, which obstructed an adjoining plot. Evidence of water problems was everywhere; hampering even well laid out plots.

103. Of concern is the construction of a permanent structure or building on one of the government-owned agricultural plots. Neither the Department nor the Ministry for Agriculture could confirm that permission for this construction was granted.

104. Better management of plot assignments is needed. Often this determined either by the family of a deceased farmer assuming possession of the property, or by the existing farmers at Paraquita Bay occupying plots that appear inactive. Some farmers are allowed to occupy multiple plots, some of which remain unused. There needs to be a system for the Department to reclaim inactive or underused plots to allow other interested parties the opportunity to cultivate commercially.

## **Addendum Conclusion & Recommendations**

### **Addendum Conclusion**

105. The duplicated application process introduced uncertainty that resulted in qualified individuals being excluded from grant awards.

106. The agricultural property in Paraquita Bay is a significant public resource for commercial farming. This is currently not being maintained in a way that promotes agricultural production. The ad hoc way in which plot re-assignments occur does not provide equitable opportunities for other prospective and capable farmers and contributes to the significant number of plots that remain inactive and underused.

### **Addendum Recommendations**

1. The Department should follow-up with legitimate commercial farmers and fishermen (as defined in the policy) who were inadvertently omitted from the COVID Grant process and assess how or whether the Government can assist their production levels.
2. Inactive or underused plots should be reclaimed by the Department. This will allow the Government to invite interested parties to submit proposals for the assignment of these plots.
3. Issues related to fencing, water access, storage, and overall plot conditions at Paraquita Bay should be addressed to promote development of agricultural production.
4. The Ministry should take necessary steps to address any unauthorized construction that has occurred on public property.
